2014 Prophecy Conference Highlights Set

1. Jim Showers - An Overview of Romans 9-11

- Jim introduces an overview of Romans 9-11, and explains why this portion of scripture is so important in regard to understanding prophecy. To study prophecy, we have to comprehend Israel's role, and from the time of Abraham, Israel has been central to God's plan to redeem the world.

2. David Levy – Israel's Problem

- In verses 1-3, David speaks about Israel's problem of unbelief by looking at the cruelty, conversion, confidence, compassion, and commitment that defined the life of the apostle Paul and how his concern for the house of Israel should mirror our own.

3. Steve Herzig – Israel's Privileges

- Steve explains in verses 4-5 how God has called His chosen people, whom He has given tremendous privileges, to display His glory.

4. Pat Neff - Israel's Position

- In Romans 9: 6-7, Pat sheds light on the fact that God is not finished with Israel or the Jew. Rather, Israel is secured by a sovereign God whose promises are indestructible and whose faithfulness never fails.

5. Andy Ferrier – Israel's Promise

- Covering verses 8-13, Andy looks at the distinction between physical and spiritual Israel and how our love for Israel should be like God's love for Jacob.

6. Charles McCracken - Israel's Preparation

In Romans 9: 14-24, Paul anticipates questions his audience will have and asks two questions; "Is there unrighteousness with God?" and "Why does God find fault?"
Charles leads us through this scripture as we study Paul's response to the Romans.

7. Clarence Johnson - Israel's Prophets

- Verses 25-33 is a difficult, much debated portion of scripture that is used by all sides in theological arguments regarding Israel. Clarence provides insight about this passage as we look at the restoration, remnant, and righteousness of Israel.

8. Pat Neff - Israel's Zeal

- In Romans 10: 1-13, Pat takes a look at how Paul's heart's desire and prayers for Israel are that they may be saved.

9. Bruce Scott - Israel's Need

- Bruce explains in verses 14-21 that Paul argues that it's not that Israel has not heard the good news, but rather that Israel's problem is they didn't obey the Gospel.

10. Charles McCracken - A Rejected People

- Starting off chapter 11 of Romans, Charles provides insight into verses 1-5 as Paul states that God has not rejected or cast away His people. God's four unilateral covenants are used to prove the point.

11. David Levy - A People of Law or Grace?

- David breaks down the meanings of the law and grace in verse 6. He explains why the law was written and the true reason for grace, for the glory of God.

12. Bruce Scott - A Blind People

- Why has God harden His people's heart? Why has He blinded their eyes? Bruce takes the very emotional passage of verses 7-10 and explains why God has allowed them to continue in unbelief.

13. Steve Herzig - A Diminished People

- Steve explains in verses 11-12 that even though the Jewish people have been blinded, they are not forgotten. God has allowed this for the world to come to Christ. But they are not cast out forever, God still has a plan for them!

14. Andy Ferrier - A Jealous People

- Andy explains in verses 13-20 why God has given the Gentiles the privilege of being grafted into the branch while the Jewish people remain the natural branches.

15. Clarence Johnson - A Mysterious People

- As Clarence speaks about verses 21-25, we see that Paul sends a word of warning to Gentile Christians regarding the attitude they have toward Jews who have rejected the Messiah.

16. Steve Herzig - A Repenting People

- Steve wraps up chapter 11 by explaining verses 26-36 by answering the question of whether "all of Israel being saved" refers to individuals or rather national Israel.
