The Sign of His Coming

I. This year's conference will consider a very important question

 - 2. They were all Jewish & concerned about the future of Israel
 - a. They were ready for Jesus to restore the Kingdom, Acts 1:6
 - b. Jesus' words of destruction complicated everything
- B. The Setting Mt. of Olives, Jerusalem
 - 1. Olivet Discourse named after the setting
 - 2. Jesus was on His way from the Temple to Bethany
 - a. He had contended with the religious leaders
 - b. Foresaw the coming destruction of Jerusalem and the Temple
 - i. Seemed impossible to the disciples
 - ii. Temple one of the wonders of the ancient world aa. Largest structure in the Roman Empire
 - 3. Four disciples Peter, James, John & Andrew (Mk. 13:3), approached Him with two burning questions
 - a. Their concern with Jerusalem and the Temple destroyed, how could Messiah rule over Israel?
 - 4. Two questions
 - a. When will Jerusalem and the Temple be destroyed?
 - b. What will be the sign of Your return and the end of the age?
 - 5. Jesus sat down on the Mt. of Olives and spoke to them
 - a. Overlooking Jerusalem and the Temple
- C. The Subject -Jesus' Second Coming & end of this age
 - 1. Over the years, ongoing debate over Jesus teaching
 - a. Does it include the Rapture of the church?

- b. Or just Christ's Second Coming?
- 2. Those who see the Rapture
 - a. Point to "But of that day and hour no one knows" (Mt. 24:36)
 - i. But Christ's return can be marked 1,260 days from abomination of Temple (Dan. 12:7; Rev. 12:6)
 - b. One Second Coming in two phases Rapture & Return
- 3. Why the Rapture is not in the Olivet Discourse
 - a. Rapture is not a Second Coming
 - i. We will meet Christ in the air, 1 Th. 4:17
 - b. Evidence for return of Christ only
 - i. Christ is speaking to the Jewish people
 - ii. Church is not in view here, nor has it begun yet
 - iii. Focus is on Christ's return & the Kingdom of God
 - aa. Jesus is addressing the disciples' concern
 - » With the Temple destroyed, when will Jesus come to establish God's Kingdom?
 - c. At His First Advent, Jesus offered the Kingdom to Israel
 - i. They rejected Him and His offer
 - aa. The Kingdom won't come until Israel repents and accepts Him
 - ii. Jesus is warning about the Tribulation that will come before Israel accepts Him
 - d. No one can be certain of the day or hour of Christ's return to Earth
 - i. Signing of covenant (Dan. 9:27) and abomination of desolation (Mt. 24:15) are both a series of events
 - aa. They take place over days, weeks, or months
 - bb. No one can say when God begins counting
 - » Not even the angels, who revealed the 1,260 days to Daniel, know the exact time (Mt. 24:36; Acts 1:6-7)
 - e. Dr. Renald Showers presents a helpful chart of the differences between the Rapture & Second Coming

- - f. The disciples understood there would be an end to this Age
 - i. Present sin-cursed period of human history
 - aa. Began when Adam joined Satan's rebellion (Gen. 3)
 - bb. Satan became the ruler of the powers of the air (Eph. 2:2) and earth
 - » Adam handed over dominion of the Earth to Satan when he sinned (Lk. 4:6)
 - ii. Disciples also believed in a restored theocratic Kingdom of God on Earth
 - aa. It would be restored to Israel (Acts 1:6)
 - bb. With God's representative, Messiah, as ruler
 - » Paul calls Jesus the last Adam (1 Cor. 15:45)
 - iii. Israel is key to end of this age and the coming of Messiah aa. This is why Israel remains vitally important today
 - iv. One reason God raised up The Friends of Israel Gospel Ministry
 - aa. Teach biblical truth about Israel and the Messiah
 - v. The Disciples believed Jesus was the One who would end this Pre-Messianic Age
 - aa. They were curious to know when & how they would recognize the end

The Great Tribulation

The Great Tribulation will be an event unlike any other in human history. As the prophet Malachi says it, God's wrath will be as a refiner's fire or a launderer's soap, cleansing the earth from the stain of sin that's plagued it since the fall. During this time of judgment many in Israel will search for a deliverer to save them from torment and in total desperation they will eagerly follow any false prophet or messiah who promises to protect them, yet in reality will only lead them away from the truth. Jesus makes the most of this opportunity from the Mount of Olives to encourage the disciples to stay focused on Him, and to know that His Second Coming won't be typical; it will be one you won't miss.

Christ's Second Coming

The most significant event of biblical prophecy is without question the Second Coming of Jesus Christ.

The sequence of events that take place at His Second Coming are nothing less than spectacular, but before looking at them, we need to understand two important truths about the Olivet Discourse.

- 1. Matthew 24 and 25 are about Israel, not the church.
- Matthew 24 and 25 are not about the Rapture, but about the return, i.e., the Second Coming to rescue Israel and establish the Messianic Kingdom.

In our text the Lord Jesus Christ mentions three remarkable events or signs that will accompany His Second Coming.

- I. The Solar System (v. 29) "Coming apart at the seams...." A. Joel 2:10, 31; 3:15–16
 - B. Isa. 13:10; 24:23
 - C. Luke 21:25-26
 - D. Haggai 2:6-7



Christ's Judgment of the Nations

Old Testament prophets like Joel would often judge Israel for their sins against God, and then those same prophets would turn and judge the nations for their excessive abuse of Israel. Jesus–who is Prophet, Priest, and King–executes a similar prophetic structure in Matthew 25. First, Jesus judges Israel for their preparedness or lack there of concerning His Second Coming. Then, Jesus concludes the Olivet Discourse judging the nations for their treatment of "the least of these brothers of mine."

- A. What guestions did Jesus' disciples ask that prompted Jesus to deliver His Olivet Discourse?
 - 1. Tell us, when will these things be?
 - And what will be the sign of Your coming, and of the end of the age? 2.
 - a. They believed in two ages present, sin-cursed age & restored Kingdom Age to come
 - b. Jesus, the Messiah, is the key to ending this age & restoring the world

- B. Since the Bible presents two different gospels, which one must be preached before the end of the Age?
 - The Gospel of the Kingdom must be preached in all the world (Mt. 1. 24:14)

C. What is the unparalleled time of trouble for the people of Israel? 1. Called the Time of Jacob's Trouble, (Jer. 30:7)

MATTHEW 24–25 JIM SHOWERS

a. Characterized as birth pangs

- 2. Jesus calls second half a time of "great tribulation" (Mt. 24:21)
 - a. Unprecedented time of trouble
 - b. Beginning is marked by the "abomination of desolation" (Mt. 24:15, Dan. 9:27)
 - i. Temple will be defiled with an image of Antichrist
- 3. This time is followed by birth of the Messianic Age
 - a. Final Jewish return to their homeland (Jer. 30:4-10)
 - i. Where Israel will live in peace under a Davidic King
- D. What will cause the Antichrist's radical change from being Israel's protector to being its chief enemy?
 - 1. Satan & demons are permanently cast down to Earth (Rev. 12)
 - a. At the mid-point of the seven years
 - b. Satan knows his time is growing short
 - i. He must annihilate Israel
 - aa. To retain control over the world system
 - 2. Satan will possess the Antichrist (Rev. 13)
 - a. Influence him to stop Jewish worship in the Temple
 - i. Seize the Temple
 - ii. Establish himself as God erect an image of himself
 - iii. Demand all to worship him
 - b. Through Antichrist, Satan will seek to eliminate Israel
 - i. Jewish people will flee to wilderness for 1,260 days
- E. What is Israel's role in the restoration of God's theocratic Kingdom to the world?
 - 1. God's restoration goes through Israel
 - a. Israel is central to God's redemptive plans



- 2. Before Messiah can come again, Israel must repent of her rebellion (Zech. 12–14; Acts 3:12–21)
 - a. And be reconciled to her Messiah
 - b. Only then will God
 - i. Crush Satan forever
 - ii. Rid the world system of Satan's rule
 - iii. Restore His theocratic-Kingdom rule on Earth
- 3. Eliminating Israel is the only way for Satan to stop God's plan
 - a. Thereby avoiding his eternal judgment
 - b. He will use the armies of the world to eliminate Israel
 - i. Before she repents & receives her Messiah
- F. What will be God's purposes for bringing the nations of the world against Israel?
 - 1. God's two-fold purposes
 - a. Bring Israel to the point of repentance & reconciliation with her Messiah/Savior (Zech. 13–15)
 - i. Restoration of God's Kingdom depends on it
 - b. Destroy the armies of the world & their leaders (Zech. 12–14; Rev. 19)
 - i. Antichrist & False Prophet are cast into the lake of fire (Rev. 19)
 - ii. Satan is bound & imprisoned in the bottomless pit for 1,000 years (Rev. 20)
- G. What is involved in the Day of the Lord concept?
 - 1. Outpouring of God's wrath upon the ungodly
 - a. Time when God intervenes & no one can escape
 - 2. Great Day of the Lord concept (Joel 2:30–31; Mal. 4:5)
 - a. Great extremely terrible time, "Who can endure it?"
 - i. When God breaks into the normal course of history
 - b. Awesome have a terrifying effect on people
 - i. God's enemies will tremble in panic & be shaken
 - 3. Jesus spoke of cosmic disturbances before the great Day of the Lord comes, (Mt. 24:29-30)
 - a. Cosmic darkening of the sun, moon, & falling stars

- i. After the Tribulation ends & before Jesus comes
- b. Messiah's sign will appear in heaven
 - i. All the tribes of the Earth will mourn
 - aa. Will see Him returning with great power & glory
- H. How did some of the holy angels become evil?
 - 1. God created holy angels to serve in His universal Kingdom
 - a. Created with differing ranks or degrees of power
 - i. God is the Lord of hosts or armies
 - 2. Satan, one of God's most magnificent angels, chose to rebel against God (Isa. 14:12, Ezek. 28:12–17)
 - a. He desired usurp God & take His throne
 - i. God cast Satan to a lower realm (Earth)
 - 3. He succeeded in swaying many angels to join his rebellion
 - a. Bible says, Satan and his angels (Rev. 12:7-9; Mt. 25:41)
 - i. They obey Satan, "the ruler of the powers of the air" (Eph. 2:2)
 - b. Our greatest battles are with the principalities, powers, rulers of darkness of this age (Eph. 6:11-12)
 - 4. Jesus said, the powers of heaven will be shaken (Mt. 24:29)
 - a. Immediately following the Tribulation
 - b. Evil angels will tremble knowing their time of rebellion is at its end
- I. What did the statement that Jesus was "like the Son of Man" imply concerning Him?
 - 1. "Son of Man" is a title indicating Jesus is human
 - a. His humanity passed down through Adam (Lk 3:23-38)
 - b. Paul called Jesus, "the last Adam" (1 Cor. 15:45)
 - Jesus claimed to be the "Son of Man" (Mt. 24:30; 26:64)
 a. Who would come with the clouds of heaven
 - Daniel saw "one like the Son of Man coming in the clouds" (Dan. 7:13-14)
 - a. "like" implies the Son of Man is more than human
 - i. Daniel saw God incarnate
 - 4. Daniel's vision foretold when the Son of Man comes



- a. He comes with God's full authority to end Satan's rule
 - i. And restore God's theocratic Kingdom to Earth
- b. He is God's final representative to administer His rule on Earth and bring blessing to the world
- J. Who is the only person who knows the day and hour of Jesus' Second Coming?
 - 1. Nobody knows the day or hour (Mt. 24:36; Acts 1:6–7)
 - a. Not even the angels
 - 2. Only God the Father knows
- K. What will happen to unsaved people on Earth when Jesus returns at His Second Coming?
 - 1. Not everyone will enter the restored theocratic Kingdom
 - a. After Christ will destroys the armies of the nations & their leaders
 - b. All unbelievers (goats) will be judged by Christ (Mt. 25:31-46)
 - i. They will depart from Christ's presence into the everlasting fire prepared for the devil and his angels
 - c. This puts an end to Satan's rule over the Earth
 - d. Only believers (sheep) will enter into God's eternal Kingdom
- L. What is the major thing Christ will do at His Second Coming after He rids the Earth of Satan and all the fallen angels?
 - 1. Jesus Christ, the Messiah, will restore God's theocratic Kingdom to planet Earth
 - a. It will exist on Earth for 1,000 years (Rev. 20)
